
ZRCS Core Programs

RESPONDING TO ANTHRAX OUT BREAK

Resource Mobilised: K6.7M

Target:200,000

Reach: 116,959

Response Areas: Eastern, Lusaka, Southern, Western & Muchinga Districts

Integration of cholera messaging, RCCE, health & hygiene sensitization & awareness, reproduction of IEC materials in conjunction with MoH & Ministry of Livestock, radio programs, event based surveillance & community engagement.

Successes: Increased awareness of Anthrax and preventative measures.

Challenges: Distances between hot spot areas. Allocation of resources for a timely intervention.


Supporting operations at Heroes Treatment Centre: Provision of PPE's such as coveralls, gloves and contact tracing.

Aim: To improve the vaccination of children, under 5 years old

- Determine target areas, then find missed children, create spot map, and identify geographic clusters of missed children in relation to vaccination sites
- Collate caretaker and frontline health worker information on why children are missed
- 3. Red Cross relays collated information to MoH and partners, who act to rectify problems
- Social mobilization to caregivers and other community members on vaccination

Target: 20,000 Reach:20,000


Response Areas: Lusangazi & Petauke District

Project Objective: To sustainably improve maternal and neo-natal wellbeing,

leading to the empowerment of family.

Interventions: Health infrastructure development e.g, Maternity Annex and Mothers shelter establishment of nutrition groups, construction of latrines at facility and household level, drilling & equipping of boreholes through solarization, supporting Ministry of Health during National Child Health and Breast feeding weeks and Community engagement.
